# IQ Short-Term Mission Teams

# 4 Ways to get Involved

"Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ." (1 Cor 12:12)

Every short-term mission trip is a unique experience. There are four basic options for the focus of an IQ Team with BLF Canada: Reach, Build, Experience and Go.

### 1. "Reach" Evangelism team

BLF Canada can connect the team with a local church to assist in evangelism efforts. This may take many forms; including door-to-door, event set-up and tear down, art and drama in parks, etc, depending on team member's interests and skills.

### 2. "Build" Construction team

BLF Canada can connect the team with a local church or organization (camp, mission agency, or other parachurch organization) to assist in physical needs, such as painting, building, renovating, demolition, yard-work, and even construction (depending on the team skills).

\*Note: a team may combine evangelism and construction aspects into the same trip.

## 3. "Experience" Internship

Internships can be developed in consultation with BLF Canada staff.

Experience possibilities include:

- French language immersion
- Preaching/Pastoral internships (English or French)
- Administration internship (accounting and/or office management- English)
- Christian Ministry in French context

#### 4. "Go" Foreign mission team

There are French people all over the world. French speaking countries include places such as France and Haiti, as well as numerous countries in Africa, such as Togo or Cameroon. A Go team may be involved in Reach or Build efforts in a foreign country, or be involved in other mission work.

This fall (30 Sep-7 Oct), BLF Canada is sending a Go team to Haiti to deliver resources to Haitian pastors, teach them a course, and investigate further ministry opportunities.
